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COMMUNITY RESOURCES AND TREATMENT OPTIONS

Barnes Jewish Hospital, Perinatal Behavioral Health Service (St. Louis) – Provides screening, evaluation and treatment for all individuals, and offers individual and couples therapy, psychiatry services and community resources. Provides inpatient treatment for Zulresso.

Brave Counseling and Psychiatry (Columbia) – Provides therapy and medication management.

Lutheran Family and Children's Services of Missouri -Maternal Mental Health Program

(Boone County) – Provides therapy and case management services to mothers (and their children) battling depression during pregnancy, in the postpartum period, or while parenting.

Marble Wellness (St. Louis) – Provides in-person and telehealth therapy.

Mercy Health System (St. Louis and Hazelwood) – Provides therapy, support groups, nutrition counseling, and medication management.

Missouri University Health Care (Columbia) – Provides outpatient therapy and medication management. Provides -inpatient treatment for Zulresso.

Pregnancy and Postpartum Resource Center of Kansas (Serving the 5-county Kansas City area) – Nonprofit organization providing free 24/7 warmline (913.677.1300 or warmline@pprc. support), information, articles, support groups, and more.

St. Louis Behavioral Medicine Institute, The Women's Reproductive Mental Health Program (Macklind and West County) – Treats women's mental health across the lifespan, with a special focus on the reproductive years. Provides therapy, nutrition counseling, and medication management. Specializes in treating heterosexual, gay, and trans individuals and couples.

University of Missouri Kansas City (Kansas City) – Provides special locations for breastfeeding and pumping.

The Uplift Connection (Statewide) – Through the Missouri Foundation for Health, provides an interactive map to connect Perinatal Substance Use Disorder healthcare resources to improve the health of Missouri communities.
