COMMUNITY RESOURCES

Drug Free Moms and Babies Project (Statewide) - A comprehensive medical and behavioral health program for pregnant and postpartum women that provides prevention, early intervention, addiction treatment, and recovery support services.

West Virginia Breastfeeding Alliance (Statewide) – Works collaboratively to protect, promote, and educate the community about breastfeeding with the goal of improving the health of West Virginians.

West Virginia Healthy Start / HAPI (Helping Appalachian Parents and Infants) (Statewide) - Provides services to improve maternal well - being during pregnancy, postpartum, and the interconceptional period. Also includes services for fathers / partners.

West Virginia Home Visiting Program (Statewide) - Provides eligible families with support and education.
